CANDLE LIGHTING LITURGY

Pastor: We light this candle as a symbol of our desire for hope and peace in this season, to remember despite the darkness, light and love can seep in.

People: God, we are open to your light and love.

- Pastor: We light these candles in thanksgiving for loved ones lost, for past health and joy that now seems so distant. We light these candles in prayer, that we will feel God's love in our present sorrow. We light these candles in hope, for the promises of God yet to be revealed.
- People: Glory to God. Amen
